Support services to help injured people



Overview

SIRA's CTP Assist can help you with your CTP claim and recovery if you are injured in a motor accident. If you have any questions about the claims process, please contact CTP Assist between 8:30 am and 5:00 pm on 1300 656 919 or email us at ctpassist@sira.nsw.gov.au.

There are also a range of additional support services within the community that may be able to assist with your recovery from injury. Information about some of these services is set out below.

Note: These services are independent of the CTP claims process and may be subject to their own eligibility criteria.

Emergencies

In an emergency, call Triple Zero (000) or go to a local hospital emergency department.

HSNet

The Human Services Network (HSNet) is a website available to anyone looking for community support services in NSW.

HSNet is an online database that holds information for over 65,000 support services across NSW, covering health, disability, aged care, welfare, community participation, education, legal and housing support.

HSNet can assist you and your family in making informed choices about your support needs. Each service provider has been validated as an authentic provider and the database of network providers is regularly updated by HSNet.

The HSNet database includes information for each service provider, such as opening hours, fees, requirements for eligibility, and service delivery areas.

Ability Links NSW

Ability Links NSW is a free program to help people with disabilities. It is available for people aged up to 64 years, and carers and families of people with disabilities.

If eligible, the service matches you with a case worker (known as a 'linker') to work closely with you to provide one-on-one support so that you can better achieve your personal goals, which may include participating in sport, education, volunteering or other activities.
