Subject: Review of the NSW self-insurer licensing framework

Dear SIRA,

As a retired WokCover NSW Safety Inspector, 1989 to 2007, I believe that workplace safety is a very important compliance activity in ensuring a safe place of work for NSW workers and their families.

From my experience in investigating many many accidents including fatalities a large proportion of those could possibly have been avoided if the employer had been more proactive in their work place safety activities. Some of those accidents including two fatalities that I am aware of occurred at organisations that are and were at the time self-insured. I further believe without the ongoing compliance of workplaces including self-insurers those incidents would be much higher in number

I support the current self-insurer licensing framework. I support the current regulatory monitoring of Self-Insurers, in particular NAT auditing by the Regulator. Regarding NAT audit frequencies, I support the current 3 year audit frequency for those Self-Insurers that meet the benchmarks and annual audits for Self-Insurers that don't meet the benchmarks as to change this would potentially compromise workplace safety

From my experience allowing organisations to self-regulate, even in part, is a failure without employers being held to account by compliance by the regulator
