# Workers compensation rates for general practitioners – effective 1 July 2022

## State Insurance Regulatory Authority (SIRA) payment classification system information – professional medical services

This document summarises commonly used codes by general practitioners.

All medical practitioners treating workers compensation patients should refer to the *Workers Compensation (Medical Practitioner Fees) Order* current at the date services are delivered for further information.

| AA010                       | Level A consultation                      | \$42.50 | The rate for consultation fees applies to services provided on or after 1 July 2022. GST should not be charged on the consultation fee.  Australian Medical Association (AMA) codes must be used for all consultations and medical treatment services, apart from consultations via telehealth.  |
| AA010T                      | Level A consultation via telehealth       | \$42.50 |  |
| AA020                       | Level B consultation                      | \$86    |  |
| AA020T                      | Level B<br>consultation<br>via telehealth | \$86    | Telehealth means delivery of consultations via video or telephone. Consultations would be inclusive of any electronic communication to support the delivery of the treatment service. Telehealth consultations must be consented to by the worker and practitioner.  Practitioners are responsible for delivering telehealth consultations in accordance with the principles of professional conduct and the relevant professional and practice guidelines to ensure that all care is taken to ensure the safety, appropriateness, and effectiveness of the service. |

| AA030T                      | Level C<br>consultation<br>via telehealth | \$158   |  |
| AA040                       | Level D consultation                      | \$240   |  |

| WC0001                      | Certificate of capacity   | \$49.30<br>(plus GST)       | Initial certificate of capacity.  This fee is payable only once per claim for completion of the initial certificate of capacity.  The certificate of capacity can be   |
| WC0002                      | Services<br>provided in<br>addition to<br>usual medical<br>management | \$24.70/5 min<br>(plus GST) | downloaded from the SIRA website.  This fee remunerates any time spent by the medical practitioner (in addition to usual medical management) to assist the worker to recover at/return to work.  These rates may cover discussions with  |

|                             | Case conference   | \$24.70/5 min<br>(plus GST) | Case conference means a face-to-face meeting, video conference or teleconference with any or all of the following parties – worker (including a support person, if requested by the worker), employer, workplace rehabilitation provider, insurer or other treatment practitioner/s delivering services to the worker. Discussion must seek to clarify the worker's capacity for work, barriers to return to work and strategies to overcome these barriers via an open forum to ensure parties are aligned with respect to expectations and direction of the worker's |

|                             |                     |   | recovery at work/return to suitable employment. If the discussion you have is with the worker and their chosen support person, it must include another third party to be considered a Case conference.  Discussions between the worker's nominated treating doctor and other treating practitioners (e.g. allied health practitioners, medical specialists/surgeons) relating to treatment are considered a normal interaction between referring doctor and practitioner. This is not to be charged as a Case conference. |
| WC0004                      | Other medical items | Cost price  | Bandages, dressings, etc.   |
| WC0005                      | Medical<br>records  | \$60 for electronic medical records. \$38 for hard copy medical records of up to 33 pages, then \$1.40 for each additional page. These fees include postage and handling. | Fee for providing copies of medical records (including the treating general practitioner, specialist or consulting surgeon's notes and reports). Where medical records are maintained electronically, a flat fee applies for provision of all requested clinical records held by the medical practice.  A medical practitioner/practice should not provide or bill for hard copy medical records if they are maintained electronically.  Fees for production of medical records are not inclusive of GST.                 |
